IDENTIFICATION:

The True Cross was identified among three discovered crosses when it miraculously healed a dying woman, confirming it as the authentic cross of Christ.



- ◆ EMPRESS HELENA'S DREAM: Before discovering the cross, St. Helena reportedly had a dream instructing her where to dig in Jerusalem.
- ♦ STOLEN AND RECOVERED: The True Cross was taken by the Persians during their 614 AD sack of Jerusalem. It was returned in 630 AD by Emperor Heraclius, who—legend says—entered barefoot, carrying it humbly.
- ♦ Church of the Holy Sepulchre: The site of the discovery, believed to be both the place of Crucifixion and Resurrection, houses part of the True Cross to this day.

THE CROWN OF THORNS



DISCOVERED

c. 409 AD

St. Paulinus of Nola refers to a crown-of-thorn relic in Jerusalem

DISCOVERED BY

Thus, while the relic wasn't "discovered" by a single person, its veneration is clearly attested from the early 5th century onward in Jerusalem.

DISCOVERED IN

Basilica on Mount Zion, Jerusalem

LOCATIONS

Originally venerated in Jerusalem, transferred to Constantinople by 1063, acquired by King Louis IX of France in 1239, and housed at Sainte-Chapelle then moved to Notre-Dame de Paris since 1801.



- ◆ No Thorns Remain: The Paris relic is a reed circlet; its thorns were distributed as relics in the Middle Ages.
- ♦ COSTLY PURCHASE AND SACRED DESIGN: Louis IX paid 135,000 livres—half of France's annual revenue—for the Crown of Thorns, more than the cost of building Sainte-Chapelle, a stunning church solely to house the relic.
- ♦ 135,000 LIVRES: A sum equivalent to roughly 70 years of combined lifetime earnings for a well-off medieval citizen.
- ♦ Napoleon Restored It: After the Revolution, Napoleon returned the relic to the Church in 1801, placing it in Notre-Dame.
- ♦ SURVIVED 2019 FIRE: Firefighters and Chaplain Fournier saved the Crown during the Notre-Dame fire.
- ♦ INDULGENCES GRANTED: Viewing or touching the Crown earned papal indulgences, drawing pilgrims from across medieval Europe.

THE HOLY NAIL



DISCOVERED

c. 326 AD

DISCOVERED BY:

St. Helena Mother of the **Emperor Constantine**

DISCOVERED IN:

Jerusalem

IDENTIFICATION:

Along with the Cross, St. Helena is said to have found three nails, believed to be those used to crucify Jesus.

WHAT HAPPENED TO THE NAILS?

- 1) One nail was used to bridle for make a Constantine's horse.
- 2) One may have been embedded into • Constantine's helmet or divine for armor, protection.
- 3) Others were enshrined as relics and sent to various churches.



- MADE OF IRON: Roman crucifixion nails, including those believed to be Christ's, were forged from iron, the metal of execution.
- FAITH IN FRAGMENTS: Tiny pieces of the true Holy Nails are set in replicas, showing belief that even the smallest part holds sacred power.
- THE THREE HOLY NAILS: Traditionally believed to be preserved in (1) Milan Cathedral, (2) Santa Croce in Jerusalem in Rome, and (3) Trier Cathedral in Germany.

THE HOLY LANCE



DISCOVERED

June 15, 1098 During the siege of Antioch

DISCOVERED BY:

Peter Bartholomew, a peasant and visionary who claimed to have received visions from St. Andrew.

DISCOVERED IN:

Antioch
(present-day Turkey)
Beneath the floor of the
Cathedral of St. Peter

IDENTIFICATION:

At a desperate point during the siege of Antioch, Crusaders discovered the Holy Lance.

This miraculous find renewed their hope, led to victory, and was widely seen as divine confirmation of the relic's authenticity.



- ◆ REFERENCED IN JOHN 19:34: The Gospel describes a soldier piercing Jesus' side with a spear.
- ◆ LONGINUS LEGEND: The soldier who pierced Christ is known as Saint Longinus. He converted, preached Christ, and died a martyr.
- ♦ HITLER'S OBSESSION: Hitler allegedly saw the Lance as a source of power and pursued it relentlessly.
