Who can attend?

- † **Campers:** Students currently in Grades 2 - 5
- † **Leaders-in-Training (LIT):** Students currently in Grades 6 - 7
(The LITs spend time as a separate group developing leadership and teamwork skills, as well as assisting the older camp leaders with running an activity station or supervising a small group of campers.)
- † **Leaders:** Students currently in Grade 8 and up, as well as Grade 7 students who have already completed the Leader-in-Training program

What is the cost?

- † Camper Registration fee: \$50
- † Leader-in-Training
Registration fee: \$35
- † Leader fee: \$0
- † Friday Adventure fee (additional):
 - \$25 for Campers & LITs
 - \$15 for Leaders (*pay during camp week*)
 - The Friday Adventure will be happening on Friday afternoon. This year we will be going to **Splitsville!** The trip will include bussing, one hour of bowling, and a \$10 Playdium card (worth 44 arcade credits).

EXPECTATIONS OF LEADERS (please read carefully):

- Leaders attend preparation and training night before camp (Friday, June 7 from 5:00 – 9:00pm).
- Leaders are to arrive by no later than 8:40AM each morning (8:30AM on the first day of camp) and will be done each day at 3:15PM. It is important that leaders arrive on time to ensure that they are prepared for their campers and for the day's activities, and that they remain until 3:15 to be present for any campers who are getting picked up late and to tidy up from the day.
- The same good behaviour that is expected and required of the campers (being safe, listening when others are speaking, respect for campers and student leaders and adults, appropriate language, participation in activities, etc.) is also expected and required of the leaders. They are role models for the campers and are needed to set a good example.
- Leaders are to remain with their own designated small group of campers or at their own activity station during the day. They should not leave their group or station to go socialize with others who are at different activities. The kitchen and other areas not being used by groups are not to be hang-out zones for leaders. Leaders should also disperse themselves amongst the campers as much as possible – they should look for open seats beside campers before sitting beside another leader.
- Leaders should not exchange personal contact or social media information with campers or leaders-in-training (cell phone numbers, emails, Facebook info, Instagram, Twitter, etc.)
- Supplies for camp have been purchased for specific purposes and in specific quantities on a limited budget. Leaders are to ask permission before using any supplies that they have not been told are for general camp use.
- Cell phones are not to be used in the presence of campers, or substituted for a watch. They must be turned off and kept with personal belongings while the leader is at camp, and are only to be used after notifying an adult leader in the event that a call needs to be made. Parents who need to reach their children are asked to call the parish office at 905 – 662 – 8593. Please understand that the reason cell phones will not be permitted is that they distract leaders from giving their full attention to the campers who have been entrusted to their care.
- The failure to meet any of these expectations may result in a leader being asked to step down.
